Horatio Herbert Kitchener, 1st Earl Kitchener, KG, KP, GCB, OM, GCSI, GCMG, GCIE, PC (24 June 1850 - 5 June 1916) was one of the British Army's most famous officers.

Kitchener's experiences were very numerous. His culminating achievements were in the early direction of the First World War and particularly in the raising of Kitchener's New Army of over two-and a half-a-million men. The New Army first went into action in September 1915 at the Battle of Loos.

He died as Secretary of State for War by drowning as HMS Hampshire hit a German mine near the island of Orknev en route to Russia.

Kitchener had visited Australia in January 1910 when he was invited to review Australia's military capabilities. He was at the time Commander-in-Chief of the British.

We have Orders of Service of two of the Australian Memorial Services for the Field Marshal. The first, was held at St Paul's Cathedral on 13th June 1916 and the one illustrated was held at the Exhibition Building on the 18th June. There were several other ceremonies held throughout Australia.
